### **Our Pathway Towards Becoming** an Affirming Congregation Wendy Graham

Riverside embarked upon the process of becoming an Affirming Ministry quite a while ago. So here is a question. What's the holdup? Can't we just apply, get the accreditation, hold our celebration, and BOOM, we're done? This will hopefully give some insight into the requirements and the progress we've made.

Education and Discernment: So far: a movie and a play with discussions after, a discussion on relevant bible passages, definitions on the bulletin board, (please take a copy, by the way), Minutes For Affirm, newsletter articles, guest speakers, field trips to other churches that are already affirming, conversations in many groups, committees and circles, and 2 surveys soliciting feedback and opinions. The topic has also been woven into sermons and other aspects of many worship services.

Documentation: 3 main things need to be submitted: ONE - Marriage policy: ours, for many years, has included same-sex marriages, but it now declares that we recognize and celebrate the sanctity of marriage between couples of all gender identities and sexual orientations, cultures, races and backgrounds.

TWO - A Vision Statement (with some mandatory wording), concerning the inclusion of people of all sexual orientations and gender identities in the life and work of the Ministry. Here, we've aligned our work and timeline with Mission Forward, the process that's been focusing on Riverside's future. Proposed Mission and Vision statements were discussed at a recent special Congregational meeting and work on them continues.

THREE - A Plan of Action for the future must be submitted. In plain words, we don't just become accredited and that's the end of it. Our goals and Mission Forward's align in this area also. Possibilities include ongoing educational events and involvement with an LGBTQ2 support group or organization. The Affirm Circle, or possibly a new Circle, will carry on this vital and exciting work.

Ongoing work and involvement is the key. I look at this particular aspect in this way. Affirming is both an adjective and a verb.

To make the rest short: A vote, accreditation, a public celebration, & moving into a future where we continue our valued traditions of treating everyone with respect, dignity, and kindness. A future where everyone feels loved, cherished, safe, included, and embraced.

**SOMALILAND**: Two men have been convicted for publicly exercising their rights to the freedom





of expression. We have asked for their immediate and unconditional release.

**ISRAEL**: Four members of the Palestinian Legislative Council (PLC) are at risk of losing their permanent residency status in Jerusalem after the Israeli Knesset issued a law that allows the Israeli Minister of Interior to revoke residency status for "breach of loyalty". We have asked that the authorities not revoke the permanent residency status of Palestinian Jerusalemites and reminded them that the deportations or forcible transfer of Palestinians in East Jerusalem are prohibited by the Fourth Geneva Convention.
